

Reporting period: 21 to 27 December 2008 (Week 52)

Summary

1. As of 27 Dec 2008, the most recent cases of human AI infection occurred in Egypt (Dec 16) and Cambodia (Dec 12).
2. H5N1 infected poultry was detected in Hong Kong (Dec 9) and poultry within a 3km-radius were culled. Serious Response Level was activated.
3. In the past three years, about 100 cases of human avian influenza infection were confirmed by the WHO annually.
4. The cases occurred in the Western Pacific, South-East Asia and Eastern Mediterranean WHO regions. More cases were reported around January to March each year.
