Influenza Vaccination for the 2007/08 Season

I refer to my previous letter dated 30 May 2007 on the updated recommendations of the Scientific Committee on Vaccine Preventable Diseases (SCVPD) for the coming influenza season (2007/08). The SCVPD recommends the following target groups of people to receive influenza vaccination for the coming influenza season, which is the same as that of the last year:

- (A) Elderly persons living in residential care homes
- (B) Long-stay residents of institutions for the disabled
- (C) Elderly persons aged 65 years or above
- (D) Persons with chronic illnesses
- (E) Health care workers
- (F) Poultry workers
- (G) Children aged 6 to 23 months
- (H) All pregnant women

The SCVPD also advises other members of the public to consult their doctors for the need for vaccination for personal protection and/or reducing the risk of transmitting influenza to high risk persons with whom they regularly come into contact. It takes the private and public sectors to work together to implement recommendations of the SCVPD. Similar to last year, the government will provide influenza vaccination to a subset of the above target groups, such as recipients of Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (please refer to the attached document or visit the website of CHP at http://www.chp.gov.hk for more information on the scope of coverage by the Government Influenza Vaccination Programme).

Enclosed please find a poster on influenza vaccination and you are welcome to collect free copies of Adult Immunisation Cards, posters and pamphlets from the offices of the Central Health Education Unit, by completing and fax the enclosed reply slip in advance.

This will reduce the risk of transmitting influenza to your patients particularly those who are at high risk of developing complications from influenza.

Finally, the following health advice for influenza is pertinent besides vaccination:

- To build up good body immunity by having a proper diet, regular exercise and adequate rest, reducing stress and avoiding smoking;
- To maintain good personal hygiene, and wash hands after sneezing, coughing or cleaning nose; and
- To wear a mask if having symptoms of respiratory infection.
